

Vocabulary Words for the "Feeling Faces and Vocabulary" **Poster Set**

The four "Feeling Faces" posters used at this grade level—"Happy," "Upset," "Surprised," and "Calm" show characteristic expressions for these four feelings. Do not elaborate or change them. Make these posters available for classroom use throughout the school year. As the students learn new feeling vocabulary words, you can add them to the appropriate posters. Even when students' reading skills do not permit them to read the words listed on the posters, students benefit from references to the written feeling words during the school day. You can also use the posters for reference as the class discusses feelings in other lessons or in classroom situations.

Students at this level are not expected to remember all of the words mentioned below, but this list provides you with a variety from which to select.
